WHY FAMILY CHILD CARE?

Component #1 CONSISTENCY IN CAREGIVING - IT MATTERS!

Erik Erikson, one of the great theorists of child development, believed trust is the key to development. Nancy Carlsson-Paige, in her book *Taking Back Childhood*, summarized his belief by stating, "Kids really can't grow and develop fully if they don't trust that adults can care for them and that they are safe and secure."

Children who come to our programs each day know we'll be there for them. We are "their people" and a constant in their lives. With trust playing such a central role in healthy child development, the fact that we're there for them day in and day out is key for giving children a strong foundation.

Never be afraid to point out that your program doesn't have turnover in staff. Ever. The bond between child and caregiver matters. Your program is able to offer the same caregiver over years to come. This is a feature that most center or school-based programs can't offer.
